

## PREFACE

In the 40 years since Congress passed the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967, the ADEA has seldom before been more relevant or topical for lawyers on either side of the employment law bar. For those representing individual employees and employers, or anyone with an interest in this ever-evolving area of law, this Cumulative Supplement provides updates through December 31, 2006 and follows the organization of the Main Volume, *Age Discrimination in Employment Law*.

This Supplement also includes developments involving age discrimination cases before the United States Supreme Court that occurred up to October 1, 2007. The text does not contain headings where there have been no significant developments under that heading since publication of the Main Volume; but the table of contents of each chapter makes it clear, by the presence or absence of page number entries, exactly where in the volume updating material has been included.

The extensive contributions of the Senior Editors and Contributing Editors to the preparation of this Supplement are very gratefully acknowledged. This Supplement incorporates updates to developments concerning the ADEA noted in the midwinter meeting reports of the ADEA Subcommittee to the ABA Labor and Employment Section's Committee on Federal Labor Standards Legislation.
