Then, for 12 years, she was the chief compliance officer and chief labor and employment counsel for a group of related international environmental services companies that operated under the names of Culligan, Metcalf & Eddy, Research-Cottrell, USFilter, Vivendi Water NA, Veolia Water NA, and others.

Christine has written and lectured extensively on a variety of matters, including labor and employment law, administrative and civil practice, ethics and compliance, and professional responsibility. She has contributed chapters to leading treatises, including the wage/hour chapter in *Downsizing: Law and Practice*, which was updated and newly published as *Reductions in Force in Employment Law* (Bloomberg BNA), and the employment discrimination chapter in *New Jersey Employment Law* (New Jersey Law Journal Books). Her writings on the topics covered in this treatise have garnered recognition from the International Academy of Visual Art (*Communicator Award of Distinction* for feature article writing) and Communication Concepts (*APEX Award* for feature writing).

Christine serves or has served on the boards and committees of numerous organizations, including the Board of Visitors of Fenway Health, the Editorial Board of the *New Jersey Law Journal*, the Board of Directors of the New Jersey Chapter of the Association of Corporate Counsel, the Committee on Civil Practice of the Supreme Court of New Jersey, and the Advisory Board of Seton Hall Preparatory School.
